Have you ever been asked the question, “Are you saved?” Protestants tend to profess their salvation the moment they believe and commit to Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior. They believe they are going to heaven. This would be nice, but not entirely accurate. In Matthew 24:13 Jesus says, “He who endures to the end will be saved.” Salvation requires perseverance in faith. Trent Horn, an apologist for Catholic Answers and convert to the faith, gives a good example in his book, “Why we are Catholic: Our reasons for Faith, Hope and Love.” He explains that salvation doesn’t take place in a single moment. Rather, making it to heaven is a process that we must cooperate with every day. Trent explains salvation with this analogy:

“Imagine you are caught in a storm on the sea with some friends and your boat is sinking. You hear a broadcast on your radio, telling you that if you want to be saved you must put on life jackets, report to your position, and wait for help to arrive. You then put on the life jackets and dive into the water...A few days later a rescue boat finds you, pulls you onto the deck, and you breathe a sigh of relief. Saved! But when exactly were you saved? Was it when you set foot on the rescue boat? Or was it when you made the initial radio call? The Bible teaches that salvation is a process that begins in the past through faith, continues throughout our lives in the present, and ends with our future eternal glory in heaven.”

While it is true that our first step to salvation is accepting Jesus as our Lord and Savior, through the Sacrament of baptism. However, it doesn’t end there. We always have the choice to do evil and avoid good. God doesn’t take our free will away from us. Hence, we need to continually work out our salvation throughout our life.

Salvation requires perseverance in faith. We need to receive God’s grace (primarily through the reception of the Sacraments) and repent of our sins continually in order to lead holier lives and prepare our hearts for heaven. So, when you are asked “Are you saved,” you can respond, “I have been saved, I am being saved and I hope to be saved.” Past, present and future – that is the real answer!

As you know, last year’s Golf Tournament was canceled due to Covid restrictions. Nevertheless, we continued to provide funds to our local 2020 graduating students. Because of this disbursement and lack of fund-raising opportunities, we have depleted our scholarship accounts. As always our Educational Assistance Program’s objective is to help local students with the high cost of starting their college careers and to support and encourage our local school children. In years past we have given numerous scholarships to first year college students and monetary awards to selected graduating high school seniors and graduating students from local grade and middle schools. We have also used some of the proceeds of the golf tournament to help defray our Christmas baskets endeavor. With the cancelation of all Knights of Columbus fund-raising events, the membership and community had to reach deep in their pockets to subsidize the 2020 Christmas giving. This past Christmas our council distributed 195 baskets of food and toys to the less fortunate families in our community at a cost of \$14,000.

With the opening of safe outdoor activities, we are thankfully able to begin planning for this year’s golf outing. To provide the funds necessary for the 2021 scholarship and awards, our annual golf outing will be held at Rancocas Golf Club, 12 Club Ridge Lane, Willingboro, New Jersey. Included at a cost of \$115.00 per golfer are donuts and coffee, shot gun start at 8:00 am, refreshments on the course, luncheon catered by Georgetti’s and prizes.
