Three brothers were presented with Honorary Life Memberships at the December 27 meeting.

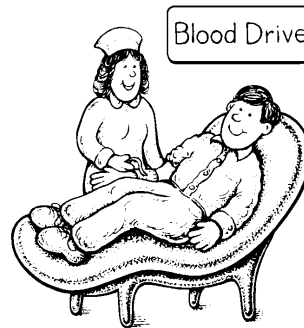

PANCAKE BREAKFASTS

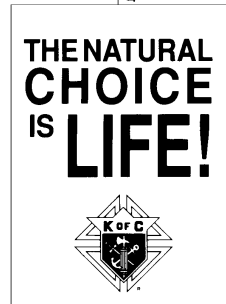
Our next Pancake breakfast will be January 6th. We will be holding a blood drive at the same
