PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE – SIMPLIFIED – PART II

This month we will review the basics of motions, the types and when they are made.

Motions fall into four general categories:

1. A **main** motion, which brings a question before the council
2. A **subsidiary** motion which modifies or disposes of the Main Motion under discussion.
3. A **privileged** motion, which has no connection with the main motion but is of such importance as to demand immediate consideration.
4. An **incidental** motion which relates to the pending motion and must be decided immediately.

OK, I see some examples might help.

Joe member gains the floor and makes a motion to donate funds to a charity he likes. John seconds the motion. This is now the **main** motion.

Bill then makes a motion to fix the time to adjourn (as he doesn't want to miss the Cats playing on TV). This is a **privileged** motion. It has nothing to do with the main motion but has to be disposed of at once. George wants to delay a vote on the main motion until a committee has had time to look into it. George makes a motion to **table** the main motion. This is a **subsidiary** motion.

Joe then decides he wants to withdraw his motion, so he makes a motion to **withdraw** his motion. This is an **incidental** motion.

Clear? The important point is that once a motion is on the floor, the discussion and making of other motions is limited. The idea is to consider one thing at a time (remember last month?) so new motions should relate to disposing of the main motion or (rarely) privileged or incidental motions.

A main motion is usually disposed of in one of the following ways

1. A vote is taken
2. A motion to **table** the main motion is made and approved.
3. A motion is made to **amend** the original motion which is approved. Then the amended motion becomes the main motion.
4. A motion is made and approved to **refer** the main motion to a committee.
