On Sep 13, field agents of the K of C delivered the first \$3,000 checks to affected families – scarcely more than 48 hours after the WTC collapse. Donations were made regardless of religious affiliation. Among them were a Baptist and a Jew. When a field agent delivered a check to one family, a small girl asked him if the Knights of Columbus was a large organization. “Why, yes” he said, “We are”. “Then will you please ask them to look for my Daddy and bring him home?” she asked.
