In Memoriam - Father Walter Somerville



Father Walter Somerville went home to the Lord on July 20th. Most of us knew him as Father Walt. He was a member of the Knights of

Columbus and the Msgr. James T. Weber Assembly of the Fourth Degree.

Father Walt was ordained in 1953 for the Archdiocese of Chicago and served several parishes in the area. Due to frail health, he retired to Tucson in 1992. He celebrated Mass often at St. Pius before being confined to a wheelchair.

Services were held at St. Pius X Church on July 25 at 5:00 PM. In attendance were four priests and friends from the Archdiocese of Chicago, Father Gerry and Father Harry and Bishop Kicanis. The Fourth Degree Knights provided a Guard of Honor and rendered a memorial service prior to the Mass. Brother Ed McGillivray was among those who spoke fondly of his memories of Father Walter.

Knight of the Year 2003-2004

Brother Joseph Kerns was awarded the distinction of Knight of the Year for St. Pius X Council 10762 for the fraternal year 2003-2004. Our sincerest congratulations and thanks to you Joe, for all you do for the Knights.

Here is a little more information about Brother Joe.

Our Knight of the Year was born in 1921 in Pottsville, Pennsylvania. Joe likes to say that he and two brothers were born on Church property because in 1928 a Church was built on the site. The church still stands there today and Brother Joe visited it earlier this year.

After graduation from St. Joseph's High School in Philadelphia, our Knight worked at the Ben Franklin Hotel in Philadelphia for a time before enlisting in the US Army Air Corps in 1940. He trained as a mechanic at Chanute Field in Rantoul, Illinois and then was assigned to Anchorage, Alaska. After 14 months Brother Joe volunteered for gunnery school and trained near Las Vegas after which he was transferred right back to Anchorage, Alaska. He was assigned to a bomber squadron which moved to the

Aleutian Islands. Our Knight served as a waist gunner on a B-24.

After a number of missions, Brother Joe's B-24 suffered severe battle damage after being attacked by enemy fighters. With one engine out and the other damaged, the crew elected to attempt to land on the Kamchatka peninsula rather than ditch in the frigid North Pacific. Expecting to repair, refuel and take off, the crew was instead detained by the Russians. Along with the crews of two other B-24's and 5 B-25's, they numbered about 48 officers and men. All were shuttled deeper into Russia. They were told they were "Americanski spies". They were interned near Tashkent until February 1945 when their "escape" was arranged. Their number had now grown to 60 as other crewmembers joined them. The Russians arranged with the US Embassy to allow the internees to depart Russia without anyone knowing about it. They were transported by truck and train, eventually arriving in a camp near Tehran, Iran. From there they went to Cairo, Tunisia and finally Casablanca where they finally boarded a troop ship and returned to the US.

It was not until 1986, during a reunion at Colorado Springs, that the US publicly recognized their status as Prisoners of War. Joe received his POW medal from Lt. General McInerney.

Brother Joe has been interviewed by both the History Channel and the Discovery Channel. Their story was an episode of Secrets of World War II on the History Channel.

Following his "world tour", Brother Joe worked installing TV antennas on Long Island and then worked for a trucking company. He then went to school to learn the new electronic data processing equipment just prior to the introduction of

the IBM 1401 computer, one of the first successful business systems.

Brother Joe left Long Island 36 years ago to live in Tucson where he worked for the Southern Arizona Bank for 17 years before retiring. Joe lost his beloved wife 11 years ago, and two brothers, both Marines. Another brother, John, is terminally ill in Pennsylvania (he is on our prayer list). Joe also has a sister in Florida.

Joe has been a Knight for 55 years. He is a Fourth Degree member. He has held the offices of Recorder and Chancellor but prefers to work "in the trenches". His hobbies include hiking and photography,

His hard work and dedication to our council over the years have earned him Knight of the Month recognition several times. His contributions to our pancake breakfasts, religious devotions, and not the least, the donut sales program, have been extraordinary. Brother Joe's selfless devotion to the Church, the Knights and his fellow Brothers have earned him the highest honor a Council can grant, Knight of the Year.

That daughter is now a staff attorney with the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco. Their other daughter is a physical therapist. They have no grandchildren, but do have a "granddog" as well as their own dog Einstein.

Evelyn's interests include working part time as a cashier at the zoo, quilting, crocheting and most other crafts. Brother Jerry still helps out with electrical work and painting. Both enjoy the theater, especially musical comedies and are season ticket holders at the U of A and the Gaslight Theater.

They are both active in community and church affairs. Brother Jerry has worked for Habitat for Humanity and Project Reachout while Evelyn works with the Ladies' Boutique. Both are members of the St. Pius Jet Set and count money for the parish collections.

Brother Jerry is a Past Grand Knight of our council and was previously Warden and Deputy Grand Knight for two years each. He chaired the annual MR Drive for our council for several years, including the year we were recognized as the top fund raiser in the state. Brother Jerry also works on the Flea Market project, the annual Religious Appreciation Dinner, Blood Drives, and chairs the Memorials committee arranging Masses for the deceased members and flowers and cards for hospitalized members.

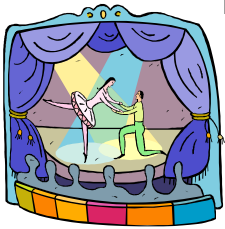
