The Knights of Columbus does it again. This time an over night trip to Apache Gold on October 9th & 10th. The cost to you will

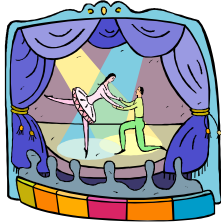

San Juan Diego Relic in Arizona

In 1531, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared four times to Juan Diego on Tepayec Hill outside Mexico City. She instructed him to build a church at the site. The bishop was skeptical about the apparition until Juan Diego opened his tilma (cloak) and revealed a life-size image of Mary which

miraculously appeared on his tilma. That image is today known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The Tilma is the most venerated relic in the world. Some 20 million pilgrims annually make a pilgrimage to the shrine in Mexico City to visit it.

The relic coming to Arizona is a rectangular piece of the Tilma encased in a reliquary suspended by a silver chain draped over a 17th Century Statue. The cloth is surrounded by relics of other saints including St. Francis Xavier and St. Teresa of Avila. It is the only time it will visit Arizona.

The venues are tentative, but at this time it is planned to be at St. Augustine's Cathedral in Tucson on Oct 30, then to Nogales on Oct 31 and return to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Tucson on Oct 31.
