On September 27, Jim McCabe, our KC Field Agent, gave an entertaining and enlightening

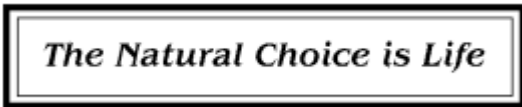

Jim explained that, being a non-profit organization, we do not pay tax on the revenues from insurance. However, the government imposes an obligation that we donate in cash or services an amount equal to one half what the tax would have been.
