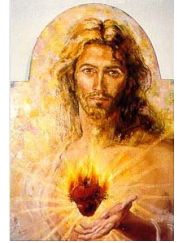

Papal Monstrance to Visit Tucson

On November 9th, the Diocese of Tucson will host the Monstrance of Pope John Paul II.

This monstrance is one of six commissioned and blessed by the Holy Father to celebrate the Year of the Eucharist. This particular one was dedicated to the Church in the United States and Canada and has been touring the two countries since January 12, 2005, when the inauguration of the project took place at the Crypt Church, Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, in Washington, D.C.

The Diocese will hold a day-long celebration on November 9th at St. Augustine Cathedral. There will be special events throughout the day and live music for certain celebrations. The purpose of this event is to commemorate the Year of the Eucharist and to benefit Vocations.

Tootsie Roll Drive Completed

Our council's drive to benefit People With Intellectual Disabilities (PWID), affectionately called the Tootsie Roll Drive, completed on October 23. Our net collection totaled \$3,362.81. This amount is about half of last year's net for several reasons: Wal-Mart restricted us to two days instead of three; the two Safeway stores would not allow us to collect there; and due to a scheduling mess up, we shared the Fry's location with Co. 13435 from Davis Monthan.

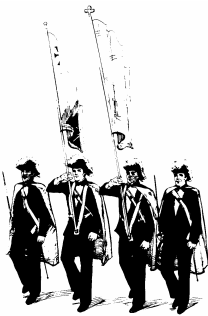

Dinner to Benefit Hospitalized Vets



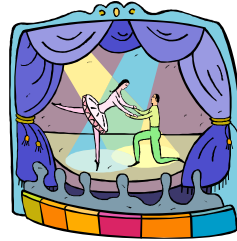
