I have been using a free service provided by freeconferencecall.com. Since I was the secretary of the little Airstream Park up in the mountains, it was my responsibility to have as many members of the board present as possible during the board meetings. I always had a quorum, even in the winter when the Park was closed and we needed to get together.

I have an app on my phone and have downloaded the app to my desktop. Each allow for the Host, the person with the account, to connect a number much larger than our organization to dial into a phone number, provide an access code, and bingo, you are on a call with everyone you need to talk to.

I will admit, it takes a minute to get used to it, but once you get the hang setting up a call it is a real boon to the ability to have key players "attend" meetings that otherwise would not. I was skeptical about the "free" part and even called freeconferencecall.com about it, wondering why such a great product did not cost a cent. Not sure why, but it is absolutely free. And anyone can have an account. I have even used it to have all my family on the phone at the same time.

Most of us have unlimited minutes anymore with our cell accounts. There are only two things you have to be watchful of with the free version. The dial-in number is not toll free. And if you want everyone to understand what is going on, you can't all speak at the same time or have separate conversations while the meeting is going on. It just won't come through the phone well.

Email Abuse

Seems like email abuse is on the rise. I have received two such items in recent days most likely trying to capture any kind of information they can mine from me. Rule of thumb: if you have the slightest doubt do not open the email or click on the link.

First one appeared to be from a friend. It was a request for me to do him “a favor.” There was no mention of the favor he wanted. I called him and found that he had been receiving calls from people in his address book indicating they had received the same email. If they responded and asked what he wanted as a favor, the answer was to purchase some iTunes gift cards. Can't remember what the rest of the email was, but it was easy to tell it was a bogus request. Even the sentence structure was suspect.

However, he told me of one his older friends purchased \$300 worth of cards for him and then called to find out where he wanted them sent. Thankfully they called him and did not ask via email to the bogus rascal that originally contacted them.

The second instance happened today when I received an email that appeared to be from Cox saying that my account had been frozen because someone tried to access it 9 times. There was a link to click on to confirm information. Hovering over the link was a dead give-away that this too was a bogus request. The email had a very legitimate look to it, but certainly was an attempt to gain information.

Things to look for when you receive email are first, sentence structure. You probably have been sending email back and forth with your friends enough to know how they communicate. If you have the least bit of doubt either delete the email or call them if you think it is important.

If there are links to click on in the email, you can hover over them (put your mouse pointer over top of the link) and you should see what the link is to by looking in the lower left of the screen or it may be visible in a box that pops up. Again, if you are unsure of something delete the email and call if you think it is important.

Another thing to look for is the phone number in the email. It may be the phone number of the people trying to mine your information. You need to look up the phone number on a bill, receipt or phone book. If you look online for the number, make sure you are on their site. For instance, if you look for the Microsoft support number, be sure that “Microsoft.com” is somewhere in the beginning of the site address. Same practice for calling anyone using the Internet to find the number.
