### *Where There Is Love, There Is God*

by Mother Teresa

Mother Teresa has done so much for the world we live in and how we view the poor and our responsibilities towards each other. Her works keep on giving, as evident in this latest release, "Where There Is Love, There Is God".

This book is a compilation of Mother Teresa's lessons to her sisters. They have not been previously released. It follows the theme of her last book, "Come Be My Light", in which she explained her own spiritual struggles. This book unveils her extraordinary faith in and surrender to God's will.

Sent to alleviate the sufferings of the poor, she assumed their struggles and pain in the depths of her heart. Her lessons to her sisters describe these times and help us better understand her thoughts.

Mother Teresa teachings show that she believed and taught about important issues that confront all of us. She had constant interaction with people of diverse backgrounds, so no situation was new to her and in this book her role is one of teacher and guide.

Mother Teresa's message is that God is alive and present and "still loves the world through you and through me". She tells us that each person is in some way called to be a carrier of God's love.

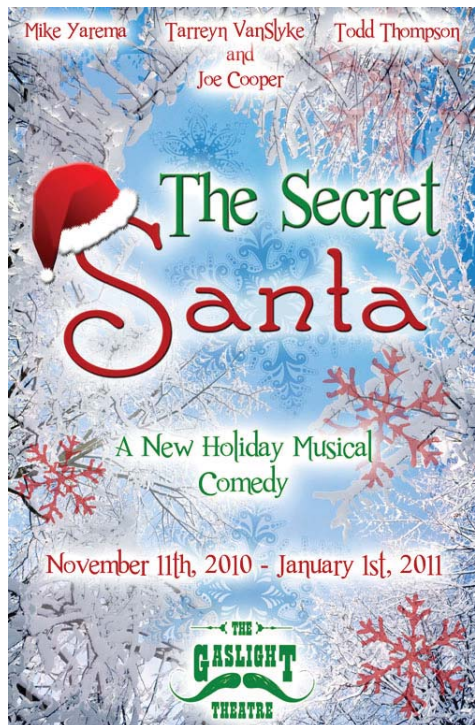

Celebrating martyrdom annually, November 1 was instituted by Pope Gregory III (731-741), when he consecrated a chapel to all the martyrs in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This celebration was originally confined to the diocese of Rome, but Pope Gregory IV (827-844) extended the feast to the entire Church and ordered it to be celebrated on November 1.

**Much of the credit for the adoption of a later ANNUAL national Thanksgiving Day may be attributed to Mrs. Sarah Joseph Hale, the editor of Godey's Lady's Book. For thirty years, she promoted the idea of a national Thanksgiving Day, contacting President after President until President Abraham Lincoln responded in 1863 by setting aside the last Thursday of November as a national Day of Thanksgiving. Over the next seventy-five years, Presidents followed Lincoln's precedent, annually declaring a national Thanksgiving Day. Then, in 1941, Congress permanently established the fourth Thursday of each November as a national holiday.**
