



But our decision to offer the breakfast for free resulted in a respectable turnout with enough free-will offerings to at least cover our cost. We also had to reschedule the Council's Free-Throw contest because of bad weather, but it eventually went off without a hitch.

Despite the extreme weather, the first 6 months of our fraternal year has been successful. The monthly breakfast has been doing very well (despite the one affected by the weather). Overall, we generated ample funds to support our program plan.

One piece of good news that you have probably heard – our "Night At The Races" is back. Recent Pennsylvania legislation has now made it permissible to hold video horse racing events. Thus is huge for us because it is such a good revenue generator. Our next "Night At The Races" event is May 17.

#### **COMING THIS LENT:**

Perpetual Adoration

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we have wonderful news: Msgr. Wargo has given his blessing to extended hours for Eucharistic Adoration for Lent. Adoration is a special time to be with Jesus in quiet prayer or reading or just sitting in His presence. All parishioners are encouraged to commit to one specific hour of adoration each week.

Why one hour? Because Jesus asked his disciples to stay awake and pray one hour with Him while He was in the garden of Gethsemane prior to His passion and death. We are privileged to answer that same call and spend an hour with Him in our Adoration Chapel.

Adoration hours will be round the clock from 9AM on Monday through 8AM on Saturday each full week of Lent. During the week of March 2, the extended-hours schedule will begin on Thursday at 9AM through Saturday at 8AM. The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed whenever Mass is being said (e.g., funerals, scheduled Masses) as per Church guidelines.

Our goal is to have at least two adorers per hour to insure that, in the event one person is unable to attend due to sickness, family emergencies, etc., there will still be another person present.

We encourage you to sign up for an open hour and especially consider the late evening and overnight hours if you are able to do so, since they are the most difficult to cover, but also the most peaceful hours.
