
From the Grand Knight

Chaplain's Message

"The Faithful Departed"

Brother Knights:

In the 27 years that I have been a Priest, I have found that one of the most frequently misunderstood teachings of the Church by the faithful, as well as non-catholic's, is without question, the teaching of Purgatory. The misunderstandings range anywhere from confusing it with "limbo" to some sort of a "third option" when we pass from this life. Fortunately for us, neither is the case. That is a good thing.

A more theological treatment of Purgatory, as well as the scriptural basis for it, is given in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Numbers 1030-1032.

Actually, Purgatory is not a very complicated dogma of our faith. Unlike Heaven or Hell, Purgatory is not eternal. It is temporary. It is not a place so much as it is a process of purification that is experienced by those who will eventually enter Heaven, but must first be cleansed of imperfections and transgressions which they incurred in this life, not sufficient to put them in Hell. The Church refers to this as temporal punishment, or punishment for a time. The anguish, the longing, the intense desire to finally enter eternity with our Lord is the "punishment" that is being referred to.

So, how can we help the faithful departed? We can do so by lessening that time of purgation, that time spent in Purgatory. We do this by prayers and good works on their behalf. We remember them daily and every time we participate in Mass.

We offer Masses for them. It is never a frugal or ineffective thing to pray for the faithful departed. If they have already entered into the Kingdom of God, others will benefit from our prayers and good works; especially those who have no one to pray for them, or those to whom we refer to as: "the poor souls in Purgatory".

During this month of November particularly, the Church asks us to focus on the faithful departed. We celebrate those we believe to be in the presence of God by the lives they lived on this earth on November 1st, the Feast of All Saints. We remember those who are in Purgatory—particularly those who have no one to pray for them—on November 2nd, the Commemoration of All Souls.

As Knights we give tremendous witness to our belief in a merciful and loving God by remembering in our thoughts, words, and deeds "... those who have gone before us marked with sign of faith." May all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. And may all those who have gone before us be assisted by our prayers and the intercession of our patroness and mother—Mary, Star of the Sea.
