Please pray for the repose of the soul of Brother Tom Wiedemer who past away in September at too young of age.

This is a VERY busy month for the Council. A Life chain supporting the unborn was held on October 2nd along College Road. 106 Knights, family and supporters lined a section of the busy road holding signs of support. Other sections of the road were also covered by other religious and civic groups.

Brother Rich Schrum organized a successful Membership drive at the Basilica with 7 solid new member contacts and 4 transfers. Knights of Columbus State Chaplain Father Bill Lesak celebrated the Masses and spoke of the merits of joining the Council.

A successful Blood Drive was conducted on Saturday with 17 units donated. This not only helps those that need the blood but it earned the Council \$340. Due to a scheduling conflict with a crew filming a movie in the Upper Rom and a Hispanic group conducting a conference in Tileston we were bumped from our assigned location but the film crew being accommodating set us up with a good location and in addition gave us a donation of \$350.00.

However, the concurrent Food Drive was disappointing. We failed to collect any significant amount of food stuffs. Therefore, we will have a food drive for the Sister Issaic Center at the Leland Piggly Wiggly on Saturday November 5th. Thanks to those brothers who did bring food that Saturday and at the Leadership meeting on the 11th.

At the Leadership Meeting the team held our first in person exemplification. New Member Ray Davis is now a 3rd degree knight and former 1st degree member Gustavo Rodea is also now a 3rd degree Knight.

Our Family picnic has been postponed until the Spring of 2023. A new date is April 15, 2023.


Meals on Wheels
