#### **State Raffle**




We have received our allotment of state raffle tickets for the year. This is an annual raffle sponsored by the North Carolina State Council to garner support for the programs that the state council sponsors. We received 400 tickets to sell at \$5.00/ticket. Of that five dollars our council keeps half. This is an opportunity for our council to make some money. Our council can make \$2000.00 if we do a great job with these tickets. The prizes that can be won from this raffle are great; the first place winner wins \$5000.00.

Council 1074 has established a separate fund that we use to pay for special events. Money collected from the sale of these raffle tickets will support that fund.
