## HOPING TO INSPIRE AND GUIDE

My Brother Knights,

Lent is upon us. It is opportunity, NOT TO SUFFER, but rather to improve our RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD (thank Msgr. Deutsch for that smart message). It is a time for us to increase our adoration of the Lord, to Fast, give Alms, Pray, and do good works – thus getting closer to God.

Ash Wednesday Scripture readings give us guidance on living a good Lent.

First from the Book of the Prophet Joel:

"Even now says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning. *Rend your hearts, not your garments*, and return to the Lord, your God." (*emphasis added*)

And from the Gospel of Matthew:

'Jesus said to his disciples: "Take care not to **perform righteous deeds** in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will not have no recompense from your heavenly Father.

When you **give alms**, do not blow a trumpet before you ... but when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees you in secret will repay you."

"When you **pray**,... ..go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees you in secret will repay you."

When you **fast**, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. ... When you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden."

What these reading tell me, is Lent is to grow closer to God, to show HIM that you adore him and are focused on HIM. Jesus, after his 40 days in the desert without eating, fought the devil's temptation to want earthly things (turn stones into bread), to want power and recognition (receive all the earthly lands below), to expect God to do your bidding (call the angels to catch you).

Brothers, go forth this Lent and beyond, and Share your blessings and talents. Give alms and do righteous things, help others. PRAY to God all you can, focus on HIM, follow the path Jesus taught us. And FAST, to show you are not distracted by earthly things, that your eyes and heart are focused on HIM.

At the end of Lent comes Jesus' ultimate sacrifice for us. But then, He Rises. He invites us throughout the year, but especially during the Lenten season, to follow Him

### **Donation to Equine Dreams**

At our March 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting, we presented a donation to Nicole DeLarm and Mike Hale of Equine Dreams. Their organization provides individualized equine-assisted services to under-served children and adults with special needs from age 4 and up, as well as to veterans. These services contribute positively to the physical, cognitive, emotional and social well-being of the participants. They have seen many wonderful results in areas including improved confidence, listening skills, increased attention span, independence, and also walking and speaking improvement. They are located in Newark, IL and their participants come from many surrounding counties as well as from Chicago and out of state. Amazingly, they are able to provide these services free of charge to the participants because Equine Dreams relies solely on donors and volunteers. We were happy to help them with our donation.

### **Bunco Night**

We had a very successful Bunco Night on February 28<sup>th</sup>. We had close to 50 participants and we were able to play several rounds of Bunco. We also had quite a few door prizes and raffle baskets to help with our fundraising. The recipient of the Bunco Night proceeds will be CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates), a group of wonderful volunteers who support the needs of children in the foster care system as they navigate their court experiences. CASA is currently in need of many more volunteers due to the increase in the number of children in foster care in recent years.

### **April 5<sup>th</sup> Shred Event**

Our Shred Event is scheduled for Saturday, April 5<sup>th</sup> from 10am until noon. Coincidentally, that is the same morning that the KOC Easter Eggs will be filled with candy in Dempsey Hall, starting an hour prior to the Shred Event. We have an opportunity to volunteer for either or both events, and we also encourage anyone who is coming to volunteer to remember to bring your boxes of paper and documents to be securely shredded! There is no set fee for the shredding – we just ask that people make a good will donation, which will be used to cover the expense of the shredding service with the rest going toward one of our charities in need.
