Grand Knight's Message



As we are halfway through Lenten season 2024, there is still time to reflect on what the season should mean to you as a Catholic Man of Faith. This reflection should serve as the basis for your actions throughout the year. Here is something that has helped guide me in my reflection.

Bishop David L. Ricken of Green Bay, Wisconsin, chairman of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), offers “**10 Things to Remember for Lent**”:

- 1. Remember the formula.** For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan—Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving—as the three things we need to work on during the season.
- 2. It's a time of prayer.** Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, that hopefully brings us closer to Christ and leaves us changed by the encounter with him.
- 3. It's a time to fast.** With the fasts of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, meatless Fridays, and our personal disciplines interspersed, Lent is the only time many Catholics these days actually fast.
- 4. It's a time to work on discipline.** The 40 days of Lent are also a good, set time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive.
- 5. It's about dying to yourself.** The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than self-control – it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like

and letting them die.

6. Don't do too much. It's tempting to make Lent an ambitious period of personal reinvention, but it's best to keep it simple and focused.

7. Lent reminds us of our weakness. Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them.

8. Be patient with yourself. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.

9. Reach out in charity. As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering, or otherwise in need.

10. Learn to love like Christ. Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on the cross for all of us.

So continue to take advantage of the days of reflection and action during Lent to pray, fast, and have almsgiving and prepare yourself to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

Chaplain's Reflection

If you attended Catholic school, you probably have the memory of candles touching your neck during the blessing of throats on the Feast of Saint Blaise, February 3. Saint Blaise was a medical doctor and bishop in the ancient Armenian city of Sebaste. He lived in the 4th century and he was known for his great sanctity. People appreciated his spiritual wisdom and healing as much as his capacity to treat physical ailments. During one of the periodic persecutions of Christians, the Roman governor had Blaise seized and in 316AD, he was martyred for his faith. His people remembered his sanctity and they continued to benefit from his example and seek his intercession. Devotion to the Saint was particularly strong in the Middle Ages, and it was then the custom of throat blessing arose due to a tale from his life in which he saved a young boy who was choking to death because of a fish bone lodged in his throat. As a child, I knew none of these things, but those annual blessings with those unlit candles pressed to the throat left a powerful impression. It was a good lesson



about the importance of blessing and the human desire for good health and protection from disease. The candles used for this blessing are themselves blessed the day before at the Mass for the Presentation of the Lord. Formerly called the Purification of Mary, the feast recalls the day when Mary and Joseph went up to Jerusalem to present the offering for **Mary's purification after childbirth** and for the redemption of their first-born son. (The event is described in the 2nd chapter of **Luke's Gospel.**) It serves in some ways as a second epiphany when Simeon and Anna now behold the Savior that they had awaited with such devotion. For this reason, the Christmas season used to continue until the feast on Feb. 2nd. While the Christmas season now concludes with the Baptism of the

Lord, this beautiful feast continues to employ the symbolism of light, recalling **Simeon's Canticle calling Jesus the "light to the nations."** On this feast, the priest blesses the candles to be used on the altar throughout the year – and the candles for Saint Blaise. Many churches have a candlelight procession as part of this **ble**ssing. **It's a beautiful Mass to attend and a lovely custom in the gloom of winter.** Even if you do not typically attend daily Mass, you might find spiritual insight and encouragement by going to your parish on the 2nd of February. The larger culture around is most interested in the Feast of St. Valentine (Feb. 14). Like Blaise, Valentine was an early bishop of the Church, serving in Terni, Italy in the third century. He was arrested and brought to Rome and martyred in 269AD. The association of St. Valentine with courtly love appears to have arisen in the Middle Ages on account of his signing a letter to one of his **converts "from your Valentine."** **As it happens, Valentine's Day** coincides this year with the observance of Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting and abstinence. Of course, Ash Wednesday is the much higher value and deserves the full measure of our devotion. It inaugurates the solemn season

of Lent and challenges us all to renew our commitment to divine love and be reconciled by the grace of the Lord Jesus. May these February feasts lift your

We are months away for our 3 seminarians that are transitional deacons being ordained as priests. **This month's column** will focus on them.

Deacon Jaime Arriaga came to America from Tenancingo, Mexico with his family at the age of 11. After high school, he worked at a diverse series of jobs, including a machine operator, cashier, mechanic, and warehouse work. He went on his first retreat at age 26 at the request of a friend. During the retreat, he radically rethought his life. After the retreat, he became involved in his parish in La Puente. At age 30, he entered the seminary. In the seminary, he learned the life of service that priests follow. **“Do not be afraid to leave everything for him, because God always provides”, stated Arriaga in a recent issue of the Angelus.**

Deacon Weifeng (Joseph) Tong is a seminarian being formed at St. John for his home parish in Weinan, China. He was raised in a Catholic family. His home parish did not always have access to Mass and on those days their family would pray at home. He fell in love with the church because of the influence of priests, nuns, and seminarians. He became an altar server at 6. At 16, he petitioned his bishop, who, in turn, asked him to finish high school first. He entered the seminary in China seven years later.

He is currently serving at St. Frances of Rome in Azusa. After ordination, Weifeng plans to return to China to serve.

Like Deacon Arriaga, Deacon Lucio Trinidad moved to the US from Mexico at age 11. He has been in formation since 2015. Since he was little, Lucio always admired his uncle who was a priest. His mom frequently took him to Mass and to praying or other activities to deal with the church. From there, he was inspired to serve the people of God and be a witness for Christ in this world.

I conclude with a prayer from St. John Vianney, the Patron Saint of Parish Priests. I ask you to consider praying this for our seminarians, in particular those who might be ordained this year.

Spiritual Warfare

Fr Charbel Grbavac from the Norbertine Order gave us a impassioned and enlightened talk focusing on Spiritual Warfare during February's open meeting. Fr Charbel brought with him salt, St Benedict medals, and epiphany water. We use visible things to fight the invisible spirits. The demons are very proud, so God uses simple and humble things with faith to disrupt Satan. These things such as blessed salt, holy water, scapulars, and St Benedict Medals are used to confound the demons.

Most Catholics don't know they can use deliverance prayers themselves to break any ties with evil spirits. Each of us have authority over our own bodies and parents have authority over their children. Parents should bless their children regularly. Deliverance prayers are constructed in three parts. First a prayer for help, then a prayer of command in the name of Jesus to break the bond with a evil spirit, and finally that we open ourselves to receive God and the Holy Spirit.

He continued to say that our armor consists of a shield, which is our faith. The Bible is our sword. Our helmet is hope, the opposite of despair. Finally, our breastplate is righteousness, by doing good works.
