## What is Cor?

On a pleasant spring evening in April, about two dozen men found seats in a parish hall recently refurbished by St. Mary Magdalen Council 12295 in Brighton, Michigan, and turned on the television.

After reciting an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be, the men pulled up a YouTube video featuring Bishop Robert Barron of Winona-Rochester, Minnesota, founder of the Word on Fire ministry, and prepared to dive into **a discussion of the previous Sunday's Gospel: Jesus meeting the disciples on the road to Emmaus.**

**"We're all on a journey," a participant observed, drawing parallels to the disciples' walk with Jesus. "We're all on a mission. As Catholic men and men of integrity, this is our mission: to share our stories with people we know."**

**This wasn't your typical K of C council meeting, but a pilot of a new initiative developed by the Supreme Council. Its name, *Cor*, is drawn from the motto of St. John Henry Newman, *Cor ad cor loquitur*, which is Latin for **"Heart speaks to heart."** Distinct from the monthly council business meeting, the *Cor* meeting is designed to**

help Catholic men build a more intentional relationship with Jesus Christ through prayer, formation and fraternity.

# Chaplain's Reflection

Pentecost Sunday (May 19<sup>th</sup> this year) is a great feast. It is one of the solemnities – a feast day of the highest ranking – of the Church year. This is the feast of the Holy Spirit and the traditional birth of the Church. It is a joyous celebration, with special colors and music. We give praise and sing, *Come, Holy Spirit, Come!*, as we recall the story of Pentecost and the power of the Holy Spirit in our Church and world. As recorded in the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit descends on the Apostles appearing as tongues of fire and with the sound of a driving wind. The Spirit empowers the Twelve to speak the native languages of all those gathered. It says later in this same chapter that about 3000 people are baptized and given new life in the Spirit that day (2:41), and from here the community grows. We celebrate this as the beginning of the Church, borne by the Spirit into the world. The Spirit has a history of giving life. The Spirit is the mighty wind that swept over the waters at creation. It is the breath of God that gave life to **Adam. The Spirit anointed Israel's** kings and spoke through the



prophets. By the power of the Spirit, Jesus was born of Mary. The Spirit descends on Jesus at his baptism and remains with him throughout his ministry. The Spirit not only gives life, but renews life. Consider the disciples in the Gospel for the celebration: hiding out, fearing for their lives, feeling the sorrow and guilt of not only losing Jesus but having abandoned and betrayed him. Locked up in their own misery, Jesus comes to them. He does not condemn or accuse them; rather, he offers them peace. He does not dismiss or deny what happened; rather he shows them his hands and side. He comes in love to be reconciled with his beloved disciples. He breathes the Holy Spirit onto them, speaks words of forgiveness, and sends them forth, just as his Father sent him. The

With the comfort and reassurance of the Spirit, they overcome their fear and return to their ministry. The Holy Spirit supports and sustains them, empowering them with gifts for the good of the Church. The Holy Spirit has given us life, and given life to the Church. But we are not perfect; like the disciples we will always be in need of healing and comfort. Thus, the Spirit continues to be poured out upon us, to heal our wounds and give us strength anew. With every intercession the Spirit makes on our behalf, with every word of Jesus the Spirit reminds us of, and with every sacrament in which we participate, we are renewed. With new life in the Spirit, we are able to go forth to love and serve the Lord.

## Vocations

We have sponsored 6 seminarians. 3 of these are permanent deacons and expect to be ordained this year.

For ordination, the current process is that the Deacon petitions the Bishop to be ordained. In May, the Deacons will be called to the Queen of Angels Center in Torrance where the Bishop will celebrate a mass and formally accept their petitions. The Deacons will also receive their first assignments at that ceremony. On June 1st, at 9 AM at the Cathedral, two of these three will be ordained (you will learn more about the third below).



Deacon Jaime Arriaga started working directly out of high school. After working for several years, he went on a retreat that helped him find his calling. He entered the seminary at age 30. The hardest thing Deacon Jaime experienced at the seminary was studying itself. After being out of school for 10 years, returning to learning was a challenge that he overcame. His best experiences at the seminary were the community with the other seminarians, particularly the community and learning to structure his day for prayer and for listening to others. But his favorite experience of all was his internship at St. Pancratius in Lakewood. Fr. Andrew Chung has shown him the “joys” of administration. Monsignor John Woolway has shown him the joys of pastoral work, including visiting homebound and making sick calls. Together these have given him a strong sense for the aspects of priesthood he will see. Deacon Jaime loves the homeless, and he will have a chance to help in some future assignment. Deacon Jaime would like us to **pray for his parents ... both for safety in traveling to the US and with joy that they were able to secure a visa to attend his ordination.**

Deacon Joseph Tong has a more complicated path to his ordination. Joseph is a seminarian from Weinan, China. He is a

student at our seminary because there are not adequate facilities in China.



**Joseph's bishop needs to** be present for his ordination. In October, Joseph played in the Priests vs. Seminarians basketball game. <https://lavocations.org/basketball-game>. He broke his tibia and is currently undergoing physical therapy. His bishop agrees he is better being treated here than in China. So, his ordination is on hold.

At the seminary, Dean Joseph learned to enjoy community life and prayer life. He enjoyed sharing, both deep sharing and learning about other cultures. He also learned the importance of having a day to recharge (6 days for his parish, 1 for recharge). He enjoys nature and fishing (with St. Peter as the great fisherman). He was able to go to the ocean while in Camarillo to fish a few times.

One thing that was a surprise is in China, political ministers will show up (particularly for important church holidays) and forbid children to attend services. His bishop visited him at his parish and was surprised to see so many children, particularly those around the altar.

Deacon Joseph asks us to pray for his classmates, pray for his healing, and pray of the church in China.



Deacon Lucio Trinidad is so excited about his >8 year journey to be a priest. His formation has found him being called each year to grow in different ways. He is very thankful to the knights for helping support him.

The ministry he most wants to pursue is working with youth. He would like to work with teens, pre-teens, and young adults. The very young need to see examples of a good life to know they are welcome. The teens
