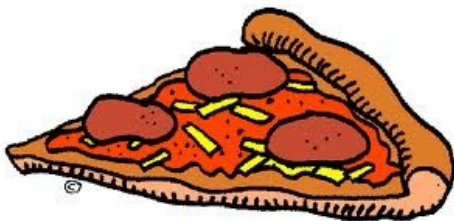

## Council Meeting Notes - Feb 12

### UNOFFICIAL (plagiarized from Dan Zavisza's meeting minutes)



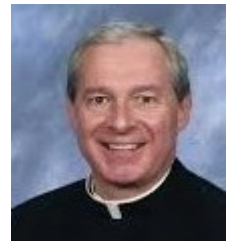
The meeting began at 1900 with 40 members present in the Hall. All officers present except Dan Norris and John Polcari, who were excused. Msgr Marc Montminy arrived late after completing Church business. The Lecturer position is presently unfilled. After 10 minutes ZOOM was closed for lack of attendees.

Minutes of January meeting were accepted as published on the web site.

**Opening Ceremony** Our Father and Hail Mary, and Glory Be by Grand Knight Tarara. All recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

### Chaplain's Report – Msgr. Montminy.

*Msgr Marc was delayed in attending due to other parish duties. He joined us later and delivered these remarks.* This inclement weather is responsible for shutting down today's Wednesday Adoration at St. Joseph church. After Easter we will celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, an event meant to evangelize for the faith. For Corpus Christi Day, a procession is planned for Sunday from St. Joseph Church to St. Matthew Church in Windham. More information will be coming.

**Divine Dinner Dates.** One last Divine Dinner will be held Friday, **Feb. 14<sup>th</sup>**. It will be held 6:00pm to 8:00pm at the Hall where the Knights of Columbus meet (Knight's meeting hall).

**TOGO Luncheon –** The Knights of Columbus will put together about 450 box lunches for this sold-out luncheon to be held on March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025. The boxes will be handed out to attendees who will go to hear a witness brought in by Fr. Jorge Reyes. This lady will relate how "she went to purgatory after being struck by lightning, and came back out". About 10-12 volunteers from the Knights have been requested to help make up the box lunches.

**Mens Quarterly Breakfast** – Was held on February 8<sup>th</sup> at St. Joseph Church Julie Hall. They had a powerful speaker who talked about forgiveness.

**Membership – It's Everyone's Job.** Ken reminded us about each member asking just one man each month to join the Knights. There was a poor response to that request in January from the members present. Ken reissued his request and will check again at March's meeting. (So you better ask! - ed)

**Knights Meeting** – A Meeting will be held on March 4<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in Nashua at the Parish of the Resurrection, hosted by the local Council, with speaker Phil Woodbury from the Laconia council. **Continuation of ZOOM?** GK Ken led a discussion about continuing to host ZOOM for our monthly meetings. Ken noted that over the last year, there has been an average of only one person per month on ZOOM. A vote was taken of the members present as to who wanted ZOOM access at our meetings and who did not. The vote was 23 for continuing ZOOM, 14 opposed to continuing ZOOM, and 4 abstentions. Paul St. Amand noted that of those voting for ZOOM, none had actually used ZOOM in the past year. Three members at the meeting who had used ZOOM either voted against it or abstained. Brother Larry Belair intended to join ZOOM this day from Florida, but his computer crashed and he couldn't attend. Bob Fournier, another ZOOM user when he is in Florida, said it was valuable for him while he was on vacation. We decided to continue with ZOOM at our March meeting, but perhaps stop with the April meeting and summer months.

**Tip of the Hat** – To Ed Lynch for organizing the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Honor Guard, to the men involved in the prayer service, and all brothers who were able to attend the wake and funeral of Brother SK William "Bill" Richards. Brother Tom Campbell, who was there, reported that Bill's family greatly appreciated the presence and support of the Honor Guard. And Ken gave thanks to Chanel Simard, who has prepared our Prayer Service booklets.

**COR "Into the Breach" – Chris Conard.** Three sessions of COR-Into the Breach have been completed. There are three topics left. The sessions are on Monday nights, February 17, 24, and March 3, starting at 6:30pm. Open to every man of the council(s) and parish(s). You can come for one or all of the sessions; each topic stands alone.

**Membership/Admissions Committee – Norm Comeau.** Two men were interviewed and approved for membership to the Knights during the month and have made their exemplification. James Barrow and Charles Ead received their 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree certificates at this meeting. (See photos next page. - ed)

Also, GK Ken announced our spring membership drive. Grand Knight requested volunteers to be at the various Parish masses the last weekend of the month to give out Knights of Columbus membership information to men of the Parish after Mass. **Blood Drive – Tom Campbell for Ed Lynch.** The January 15<sup>th</sup> session brought in 25 pints of blood. The next scheduled session will be March 20<sup>th</sup>. Tom would like some volunteers beginning at 9:10am to help with preparing and serving meals to blood donors that day. The hours are changed to start at noon and end at 5:00PM. No need to sign up to help. Just show up!

**Culture of Life – Peter Klecan.** The NH Right to Life March was held January 11<sup>th</sup> in Concord. It started at 9:00am and included a prayer service, march, and speakers at the church and the Statehouse in Concord. The Parish Pro-Life Group is working with the St. Joseph Regional Catholic School to explain the Right to Life position of the Catholic Church to the school's pupils.

**Texas Hold-Em – Rick Veilleux.** We expect about \$105,000 from the charity poker this new year. We have had 3 nights in February and will have more 7 nights in May.



Note: There are two proposed NH Legislature House Bills (one is HB531) that would cap payouts to a charity at \$50,000 per year as written if the Bill is passed. Money collected above this is to be turned over to the NH Lottery Commission for their use. This is early in the process and the bills are subject to debate and changes. Exactly how it would affect both Poker and Bingo is unknown.

**Corporation Report – Jay Cappello.** There was a meeting on Tuesday, January 7<sup>th</sup>, where nominations were accepted for membership on the Corporation Board of Directors. Another meeting was held on Thursday, January 30<sup>th</sup> to elect the Corporation Officers (Pres, VP, Treasurer, etc.) from the list of newly appointed members of the Board of Directors. The officers are:

Jay Cappello, President; Ed Herger, VicePres; Jim Harvey, Treasurer; Richard Botti, Secretary; David Demers, House Committee; George Masciarelli, House Committee; Julian Roy, House Committee; Mike Petrilli, Alan Bielevich, Daniel Zavisza, Kevin Gilmore, Bruce Silver, Chanel Simard, Carl Armano, and Ken Tarara, as GK ex. officio. *(The officer list is also [posted to our web site](#), along with other Corporation information. -ed)*

As outlined in a proposed schedule of capital expense items for the future, a new replacement stove will be purchased. Along with this, our dishwasher will also be replaced. The total estimated for both is \$11,000. After discussion, a vote was taken for the \$11,000 to be taken from the building reserve fund for a new stove and dishwasher and was approved. In addition, two fryers were to be replaced late last year. When the “reconditioned” fryers intended to be purchased were viewed by Brother Mike Banks, they were found to be in poor condition. However, he found two new ones which will work well for us.

**Lenten Fish Fry – Bob George.** Brother George has 17 volunteers for this undertaking. A meeting was announced here to assemble right after this Council meeting for setting a plan. The planned dates for the Fish Fry are March 14 and March 28, to be held at the SJRCS school gym. Patrons attending the Fish Fry will be able to make purchases with cash, as usual, and also using their credit card. The council has a card reader linked to our Zettle/Pay Pal account. Bob George and Banks realized that many younger patrons don’t use cash often, and the we could miss out by not having a card reader “point-of-sale” capability. That was set up by Paul St. Amand and Mike Banks. This system can be used in the future for Harvest Fest and banquet tickets, as well as payment of dues.

## Old Business

**Notice of Motion** for \$5,000 for Love Kirsten charity. Grand Knight Tarara. A motion was made and approved to take the NOM off the table for discussion. This non-profit charity was started by a 14-year-old Salem resident whose life was cut short in 2023 after a 3-year battle with brain cancer. The charity’s goal is to continue the effort that Kirsten started when completing treatment at Mass General Hospital to support others going through the same treatment with activity bags to promote comfort and some joy to them. A vote was taken on the original motion and was approved unanimously.

## New Business -

**Notice of Motion – \$3,000 for St. Joseph Regional School by Alex Tanguay.** Tabled to the March meeting. Description: St. Joseph’s Regional Catholic School does their annual fund-raising gala every year which is on April 5<sup>th</sup> this year at LaBelle Winery in Derry, NH. Money raised is used for their operating budget, but with a specific focus this year on raising money for a new HVAC system, which they are in need of. Cold in the winter and hot in the spring/summer causes a struggle in the old building to stay at a consistent temperature, let alone the gym having constant temperature issues. This level of support also comes with 10 tickets to the event. It would be a wonderful “marketing opportunity” for the K of C to attend, enjoy themselves, but importantly to market to 100+ young people, who are in attendance, as parents of kids in the school and who are local in the Salem, NH greater region. Lots of potential future members. Ads also come with it and would be great to get the name out as well.



**Trustee Chris Conard** forwarded a motion for \$300 to support the St. Francis School in Litchfield Golf Tournament. This school was supported in the past by a Council-2-Council grant for their playground renewal. Motion approved.

**Kevin Gagnon** made a motion for \$500 to help with general expenses for a family. William Brimmer, a devoted husband, father, and U.S. Army veteran, passed suddenly on October 24, 2024. William leaves behind a wife, Brittany, and three children, Jayden (15), Emma (12), and Jeremy (11). Brittany is determined to keep their home in Hillsborough, NH, and provide stability for their children. William served for six years active duty in Iraq with the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne infantry, and then in the Army Reserve. William served with Michael Becken, who organized a Go-Fund-Me fund-raiser to the beneficiary, Brittany Brimmer and family. They have raised \$24,285 toward their \$30,000 goal. Motion voted on and approved.

He pointed out, however, that 30-40% of extended care insurance applications get rejected because the recipient waited too long and is too old! Don't wait if you want this insurance. Also, interest rate is 4.25% for under \$100K CD's, and 4.5% for over \$100K. The Knights investment service only recommends those entities that comply with our faith.</p>	<p><b>District Deputy Report - George Fredette</b></p>  <p>Brother George congratulated our Council for being pro-active to recruit new members. Only one council in the state got more new members than we did. He reported that based on the number of families in our parish and average mass attendance, that there are still potentially 200 men who could become Knights if asked; this reinforced GK Ken's request to "Ask someone!"</p> <p>The State Convention will be the first weekend in May. At that time Deputy Fredette will announce his stepping down as District Deputy in June.</p>

**For information – Cornerstone** is urging NH churches to take in unwanted babies in addition to those that are presently left anonymously at "safe havens" in police and fire stations. Because of safety requirements and the need to be open 24/7, our Council did not think this was practical for us to do at our local (town) level. [Read about NH Safe Haven law](#) and Cornerston's new proposal.

**Fourth Degree – Ed Lynch.** The 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights meet on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of every month at the Hall. Anyone who wants to become a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree see Ed. Applicants are eligible to receive \$250 toward the purchase of the official 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knight's uniform as long as they are willing to volunteer in honor guard duties.

**Tom Campbell** informed us that the NH Camp Sno-Mo Easter Seals program for children raised \$102,000 this year. Our Council contributed to this fund.

## Corporation Hall Rental Policy

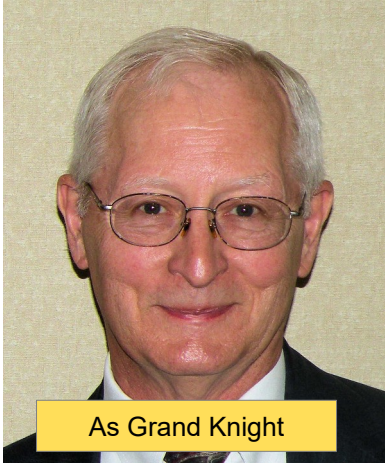


