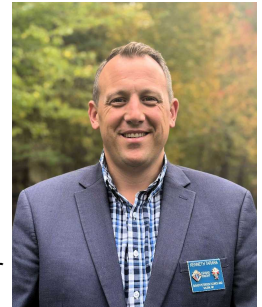

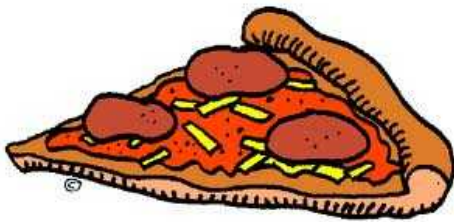

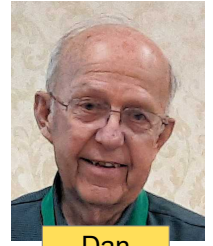

The minutes for January 14th Meeting – There were no changes proposed to the minutes posted on the web site. A motion to accept the January minutes was made from the floor, voted and carried.

Corporation Elections and Engagement to Bishop Peterson Corporation. The Bishop Peterson Corporation met in January to nominate Directors to the Corporation. A second meeting was held to elect the Directors and to elect the officers of the Board of Directors. (See page 9). Brother Kevin Gilmore was elected as President of the Board; he is also Chancellor of our Council.

Divine Dinner Dates. The final dinner will be held Friday, February 13th. There will be a free-will offering for the dinner cost. This is for married couples to get to know other Catholic couples in our Parish.

Vita Nova – Mens' Retreat. This will be held March 3-8 at the Barbara C. Harris Center in Greenfield. Housing is in shared cabins or with more privacy, but somewhat higher cost, in the Lodge. For more info: [LINK](#).

Parish Lenten Journey Events.

- Ash Wednesday: February 18, 2026.
- *The Passion of Christ* will show Fridays during Lent at 12-3PM at the hall.
- Fish Fry March 6th and 20th, 2026. Volunteers for helping set up & serve are requested.
- Walking the Way of the Cross – Good Friday April 3rd, 2026. The walk starts at St. Joseph Church and goes to Pine Grove Cemetery. There were about 100 participants last year. It is run by Brother Michael Davis and his mother, who ran it last year.
- Looking for men to volunteer to serve at the Tridium of Holy Week. About 10 members volunteered at the meeting.

Pornographic Materials in our Schools. Brother Kevin Gagnon gave a short presentation on discovered pornographic material in Salem School libraries, specifically in the Salem High School; has authored a school meeting petition urging action to remove the pornographic material from all Salem Schools. He was at the Deliberative Session and said there were 3 residents who spoke for the petition, and no one spoke against. This petition will be on the school ballot as Article 5. This is the wording of Article 5: "By petition - Shall the Salem School District direct the Salem School Board to determine if our current Library Material Selection Policy is in compliance with New Hampshire's R.S.A. 571-B regarding exposing minors to harmful materials?" (School Board web site). He urges us to vote in favor of the petition.

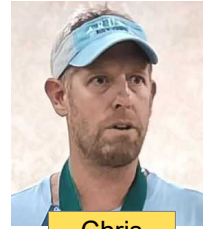

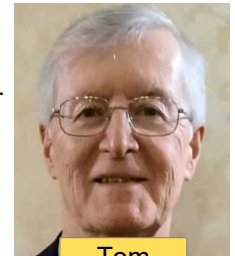

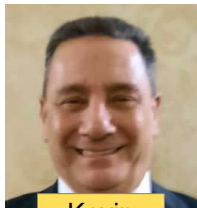

Old Business

Tabled notices of motion were voted to be removed from the table for discussion and action, each in turn.

- Notice of Motion -\$1,000 for Lights from the Knights – Brother Michael Petrilli. This is to purchase circular lights and install them at the top of flagpoles displaying the American flag in Salem’s public places. Motion remained tabled for more info.
- Notice of Motion for \$3,500 for the Right to Life Billboard -Brother Chris Conard. This is to pay for having a Right to Life message put on a local billboard for a designated period. A local organization has a contract for 3 months on one billboard. They need support. They ask if our Council will match 7 donors who donate \$500 each, for a total of \$3,500. Voted and approved.

New Business – Trustees

- Motion \$500 for Special Olympics – Chris Bamford. This was to donate for a Penguin Plunge for special needs kids at Hampton Beach. Kiwanis matched this amount. However, it was too cold to hold the water event, so the “Penguins” met socially at the Hampton Casino. The highlight of that get-together was meeting Brother Chris’ therapy dog. The kids loved it. Voted and approved.
- Motion - \$151.45 – Brother Ron Bourque. To reimburse cost of “Unplanned Movie” showings. Voted and approved.
- Motion \$250 – St. Mary Magdalen Parish Dinner for the Poor – Brother Paul St. Amand. This is support for the St. Mary Magdalen Parish Sunday meal program for the homeless, which we supported last year. On the 1st and 4th Sundays of the month, volunteers prepare and serve a hot meal to those in need. This is a parish in Berkeley, California. Brother Paul has worked on the clean-up crew when he was out there. Voted and approved.
- Motion \$500 – Birthright – Brother Peter Klecan. For baby materials to be spread to pregnancy centers on February 21st. Voted and approved.
- **Notice of Motion for \$3,500** for Inspiring Futures – Grand Knight Tarara. Inspiring Futures is a local charity that raises money to support the local youth. In years past they have supported Boys and Girls Club of Salem, Lions Club, Robotics Club, Miss NH Scholarship, Children's Smile Connection (dental care for SALEM NH Families). This local charity is exactly what our order is here for, and Inspiring futures has great connections and insight into the local needs. They have an annual event on Friday March 13, that this sponsorship would be a 'shamrock' sponsor and help them meet the many needs for our local community.



4th Degree Update - Tom Campbell for Ed Lynch. Members are encouraged to become a 4th Degree member and to become part of the honor guard. The assembly will refund a portion of the uniform fee. Also, the assembly needs a Treasurer.



Insurance Agent’s Report – Brother Stephen White. Brother White has been following eleven different investments he personally own. He found that overall, they have increased in value by about 30%. 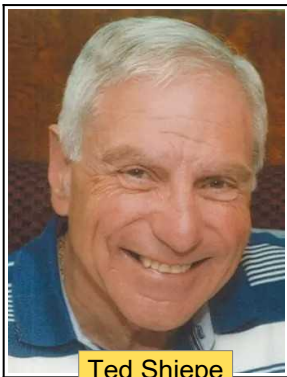

Passing of SK Theodore “Ted” Shiepe



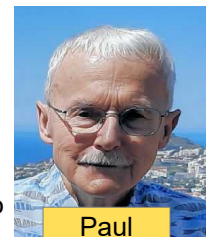
