Message from the Grand Knight

Brother Knights,

This past month we continue to set the example. Our total food donations broke the 5,000 pound mark. The council supported the Youth Ministry's Pizzas Dinner, and we collected over XX coats and will be donate \$970 (\$600 from the Council and \$370 from the website). We went into the Soccer Challenge where we have XX participants in XX categories! Thank you for the support, next up the 5K run/walk!!! Phew!

I say all this because what you do every month can fill volumes. You are all leaders in the Council and in other parish ministries or outside organizations.

I am challenging you not just to be a leader, but transform into a "Shepard". The biggest shift is shifting focus from a "Manager", one who focuses on tasks, goals control and personal gain; and adding sacrifice—not just service to the equation. Service is the "action of doing something for someone", while Sacrifice is an act of giving up something valued for the sake of something else regarded as more important or worthy. The Shepard is a combination of service and sacrifice that focuses on people, humility, responsibility and inspiration—The Shepard.

John 10 1-21 explains the Good Shepard and his sheep. Read and pray on the reading. John 10:5, states "But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." and 10:11 "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

My point is that you are known in the community, you have care and compassion for the community, you are more than leaders, you are Shepards of this family. You sacrifice time, money, energy for the betterment of the parish. With this acknowledgement comes great responsibility. Luke 12:48 states, "Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more" To put into context, you have been Blessed to be a Shepard, and the Lord will ask much of you, to each of their own capability. You must embrace these challenges and lead your flock with passion under the umbrella of service and sacrifice.

Remembering 9/11

Brothers,

It has been 24 years since that date that has changed our world. Every generation has one of those days that you will remember where and what you were doing when you found out about an event. Generationally, it was the Bombing of Pearl Harbor, the assassination of JFK, MLK, RFK, the moon landing and the 9/11.

We, as a nation, was hurt, we had this awesome power to retaliate but did not know who to strike back at. We went to war, right or wrong, with the intentions of revenge and to show the world that no one, a nation, rouge power, or terrorists could hold the US hostages.

24 years later and how our world and nation has evolved tells the story of you, whether serving as a Military or Civilian, you have made a difference. We may not see it because of our vantage points, but you must have faith that every completed action provides that essential support to our collective security that protects our country. With that, we must have faith that even if we do not agree with decisions, those who make the decisions have the nation's best interest to protect us from another 9/11. Remember Psalm 56-11, "In God have I put my trust: I will not be afraid what man can do unto me." It is not incumbent on us to take revenge. God is just, Romans 12:19 reminds us, "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord." Do you remember where you were?

I was the 194th Maintenance Battalion S3, conducting a live fire in Korea at Monkey 7 Training area, north of the Imjin River, just South of the DMZ. We just concluded our commander's terrain walk of our ranges for the next day's events. We saw the news, and my Battalion Commander called in the Company Commanders and told them to establish perimeter security, issued ammunition with Rules of Engagement, coordinated with the ROK elements in our shared training area and sent out HQs a SITREP with the fact that we had buku ammunition – not that we could stop anything, except we would be a TF Cleaver (Our BN Commander)

Bottomline, I remember everyone in the TOC and everything about that day and the days that followed. It is up to us, and our generation to help the next generation remember, lest we forget the sacrifices that followed. Say a prayer for those who gave all, for those who will never be the same, for those who still support, and for those who make decisions so this will not happen again. 2 Corinthians 4:4 states, "In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them." Ultimately, the Lord, our God will give us everlasting peace, as promised in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." Vivat Jesus!!!

Short term project: construction of a chicken farm that will serve as a business incubator, a source of healthy protein, a training center, and a source of income for our future school.

This past Summer, five volunteers traveled to Cameroon to support Flourishing Seeds to equip disadvantaged young people in Cameroon with the skills and resources to become entrepreneurs. The Flourishing Seeds’ board and the five volunteers, I want to express my gratitude for your support for this initiative.

The trip went well. We delivered our message, and we learned a lot from this experience. It was an exciting discovery and an exploration for all of us. The planning and coordination with the team on the ground in Cameroon were critical for the success of our trip. Most im-



Key Takeaways:

- Our activities on the ground occurred in three different cities (Yaoundé, Balengou, and Nkongsamba).
- We conducted workshops that focused on exposure to basic STEM, teamwork, and leadership principles. More than 200 kids from across three cities attended.
- We provided children who attended various school supplies. We equipped parents with farming supplies to help them improve their productivity and income.
- The recently built Flourishing Seeds’ Chicken Farm is already operational and serves as a training and business center



The team met and interacted with community leaders who organized our workshops, welcoming Flourishing Seeds’ visions and showed a strong interest for future collaboration.

The formation process is divided into four main stages:

1. Propaedeutic Year:

This is the initial year of formation, often after or in place of college, to help a man transition into the life of the seminary.

2. Discipleship:

During this stage, seminarists deepen their relationship with Christ and develop their human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral foundations.

3. Configuration:

This stage involves extensive philosophical and theological studies, often at the major seminary, culminating in a Bachelor's in Sacred Theology.

4. Vocational Synthesis:

The final stage includes a pastoral or spiritual year and other practical experiences, such as summer assignments, to prepare for ordination.

Key Aspects of the Timeline

- **Duration:** Six to nine years of formation is the general timeframe.
- **Education:** Candidates pursue philosophical and theological studies.
- **Practical Experience:** Seminarists complete pastoral internships, summer assignments, and Spanish-language programs.
- **Flexibility:** The exact timeline can vary based on a man's previous education and personal circumstances.





Thought of the Month:

Patience is required to Walk by Faith

Brothers,

Last month we discussed what it means to be a Catholic Gentleman—accepts the teachings of the Catholic Church; is in union with the Holy See; dedicated to strengthening Catholic men and empowering them to be better husbands, fathers, disciples of Jesus Christ through their faith and service to the Church and community. We need to set the example, be a leader in our home and community. We set the examples in our community, but how do we do that? How do we walk in God's Faith? To walk in Faith we need to be patient, and that is very difficult. In August, I asked are you strong enough to be patient? We have to believe that God has a plan for us, and that we accept His plan. To accept His plan requires faith in Him.

True Faith is to accept the risk of the unknown, and that God will overcome any obstacle that is in your path. Proverbs 29:25: "The fear of man lays a snare, but whoever trusts in the Lord is safe". Do not focus on the obstacle, focus on the trust that God can overcome it. Romans 1:17: "For in it is revealed the righteousness of God from faith to faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous by faith will live". Remember—the fruit of the tree is on the limb and branches, not the trunk. You need to climb out to get the fruits. You have to trust in God that He will watch over you. Hebrews 11:6: "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for anyone who approaches God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek Him". Jeremiah 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." God will reward those who put faith in Him. Conversely, 1 Samuel 2:30 "I will honor those who honor me, but those who despise me shall be cursed." and Hebrews 10:38: "But my just one shall live by faith, and if he draws back, I take no pleasure in him." How do you "despise Him" or "Draws back"? Despising Him is offending Him /Dishonoring Him by not having Faith in Him— Drawing back signifies the lack of Faith, that will lead to destruction. To honor God is to have faith in Him. Hebrews 11:1: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen."

These quotes reveal that patience and walking in faith are linked. As Catholic Gentlemen, we set the examples in our families and community, we MUST first understand that WE need to walk in Faith to please God. Second, we set the example for our family and community through deeds and prayer, giving Glory and praise to God for answering our prayers. And if they do not come to fruition as we wanted, we understand that it was not the right time or effort in accordance to God's perfect plan. That is patience and walking in Faith.

Are you that Strong? With God's help YES!
