Pope Francis will open the Jubilee (Holy) Year on Christmas Eve. The theme for this year is "Pilgrims of Hope." First, it is always good to remember that we are pilgrims in this world. In other words, we are on a journey during our years on earth with one eye—and our steps—moving us toward heaven. The steps are those acts of faith and charity that keep us moving forward, knowing that each step draws us closer to God. In fact, while there are many terms used for a life's journey, perhaps passage, or simply lifetime, the notion of pilgrimage changes our perspective. It captures that we are people faith, and disciples, and while we are currently in this world, we are not simply people of this world, as we also have an eye on the world to come.

We are also called to be pilgrims "of hope." That is a consistent message, for the Vatican II document on the Church in the Modern World described the Church as filled with joy and hope (gaudium et spes). The Pope is right on target, I think, because hope is truly needed in our world today. While the Christian disciple should try to help resolve problems in our world, those problems or challenges or tragedies we might face should never leave us without hope. How can that be? Christmas is certainly part of that answer.

The birth of Jesus, the Messiah, into our world is a great sign of hope, for God comes into our midst. Jesus is the Savior, the one who saves us, and He is also our Redeemer, so the world will be born anew. The Scriptures, and in a particular way the letter to the Romans, remind us: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." (Romans 15:13) As we prepare for and celebrate Christmas, and look to the New Year, let us strive to be people of hope.

May you and your loved ones be filled with expectation of the Messiah throughout Advent, enjoy the blessings of the Christmas Season, and experience a true holy year of hope throughout 2025.

Often overlooked is that the Advent season precedes the Christmas season. Advent is a time for reflection and introspection on the birth of Jesus and how we respond. The gift of God's son, Jesus, to us as a part of our salvation is unique to our religion and is not in any way similar to any other religion. In no other religion did the Deity become part of mankind in order to provide guidance, set an example, provide teachings, and finally go through the agony of the most difficult type of death as a part of our salvation. Advent is the perfect time for reflecting with Spiritual Exercises. It would be good for us, during this Christmas season, to approach the Lord in Holy Communion with an ever-deeper spirit of faith, and to manifest together with the whole Church our desire for Him to return soon.

Maryland Amendment Threatens Women and Children

This election, the State of Maryland betrayed women and children. The Maryland Reproductive Freedom Amendment, now ratified by voters, fabricated a state Constitutional right to kill preborn babies in direct conflict with the unalienable right to life. While the abortion industry and the politicians who promote it stand to profit, the most vulnerable human beings will pay the price with their lives.

So-called “Reproductive Freedom” Amendments or RFA’s are part of the abortion industry’s nationwide post-Roe agenda to impose abortion mandates in each state constitution. Over the past two years, National Right to Life has provided extensive campaign guidance to their state affiliates facing these extreme abortion ballot measures. While the odds in Maryland and six other states proved insurmountable, the victories earned in Florida, Nebraska and South Dakota will save countless human lives.

Tragically, 74% of Marylanders voted in favor of the vague and undefined right to “Reproductive Freedom”. As the sponsors of the Amendment intended, many voters were deceived into unwittingly voting away parental rights in exchange for abortion rights already unrestricted by statute. As a result, the Amendment undermines parental rights to make medical decisions for our children, exposing them to the danger of irreversible reproductive and psychological harm both from abortion and procedures to alter their reproductive anatomy.

Still, more than 600,000 or 26% of Maryland voters stood up for parents and children and voted against this deceptive amendment. More than 24,000 voters who identified as “pro-choice” were converted into prioritizing their parental rights over late term abortion.

Pro-lifers should be encouraged and trust that these efforts will bear fruit in time. As promised, “the smallest family will become a thousand people, and the tiniest group

will become a mighty nation. At the right time, I, the Lord, will make it happen.” (Isaiah 60:22)

We cannot wait for a government solution in Maryland. We know that “our faith does not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.” (James 2:19-22) God has assigned to each individual, the authority and ability to help mothers and children in need. “There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.” 1 Corinthians 12:4-6

Maryland Right to Life will continue to walk forward in faith with pro-lifers from across the state. Pro-life medical providers and pregnancy resource centers will need their legislative advocacy support now more than ever to ensure that women have access to lifesaving alternatives to abortion. They will expand their education and outreach programs to accelerate their efforts to create a culture of life in Maryland.

Knights of Columbus Surpasses \$100 Million Milestone of Support for Seminarians, Postulants and Novices

The organization’s Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) helps cover expenses during formation, while strengthening bonds with parishes, councils and communities

New Haven, Conn. — The Knights of Columbus announced today that its local councils have helped to donate more than \$100 million directly to seminarians, postulants and novices through its Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP). Launched in 1981 in response to a growing vocations crisis in North America, RSVP encourages Knights to stand in solidarity with men and women pursuing religious vocations by providing financial, moral and spiritual support. Last year, more than 2,700 local councils donated \$4.1 million, an all-time high since the program began.

“For more than 40 years, RSVP has supported tens of thousands of men and women as they answer the Lord’s call to serve the Church and the people of God,” said Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly. He continued, “Our support for vocations speaks to the love Knights of Columbus have for the Eucharist, our parishes, and the Church.”

Speaking about the experience of the organization’s founder, Supreme Knight Kelly noted, “Michael McGivney almost had to leave seminary after his father’s death because of the financial strain facing his family.

Thankfully, the Bishop of Hartford stepped in and provided the necessary scholarship that allowed McGivney to continue his studies at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. Were it not for that crucial financial support, the Knights of Columbus would not exist. So RSVP and our other vocation scholarships are really our way of paying that forward and supporting the next generation of priests and religious."

Through RSVP, for every \$500 that a local council provides to a seminarian, postulant or novice, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council refunds to the council \$100 (up to \$400 for \$2,000 donated) as an incentive. The council must also provide non-financial support such as correspondence, personal visits to the seminary or religious residence, or an invitation to the seminarian, postulant or novice to attend a council event. Councils and their members have formed strong and long-lasting bonds with thousands of priests and religious thanks to RSVP.
