CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

At Sunday Mass we generally recite the Nicene Creed after the homily and before the intercessions, but on Easter Sunday we say "I do (believe)" to the various parts of the creed as we renew our baptismal promises. In either format, it's possible to go through the Creed without much thought as to what we are saying; that can be the downside of something we recite so often.

This year is the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (now a city in Turkey), which met from May to July in the year 325. Keep in mind that the Church had just been recognized in the Roman Empire, could publicly function and worship, and so it was the perfect time to make sure there was unity in what was being taught. That was also a goal of Constantine, who had become the sole emperor, and he wanted peace among all members of the empire. This is generally considered the first of the ecumenical councils, with about 300 bishops participating.

A main topic was a discussion on the divine nature of Christ, and the relationship between God the Father and God the Son. The divine nature was disputed by the priest Arius, and his teaching was condemned as heretical. It is from there that we have come to profess that Jesus is "consubstantial with the Father." This council also agreed on a uniform observance of the date for Easter, and had the first codification of Church (canon) laws.

I believe an anniversary like this can help us appreciate how the Church reached its explanations of critical teachings, and reminds that the Pope, along with the bishops of the Church, form the "magisterium," the teaching body of the Church. All these centuries later we are still using one of the products of that Council.

This might also be a good month to take one's time slowly going through the Nicene Creed, reflecting on each of the statements, and perhaps looking for a fuller explanation of any part that is less than clear. A helpful resource for such questions is always the "Catechism of the Catholic Church" published in 1994. For anyone trying to better understand what the Church teaches on a particular topic it is a great resource.

Finally, as the State Convention is held early this month, let's offer a prayer for all who fill a leadership role here in Maryland at the council, district and state levels. May they help all the Knights and Ladies be a force for good here in our state.

Greetings, fellow Knights. Pray you are enjoying the Easter season. Hope in God's mercy is a dynamic and sustaining force in the life of a believer. It is rooted in the character of God, revealed through his actions in history, and fulfilled in Jesus Christ. This "Hope" not only provides comfort and strength but also inspires a life of faithfulness and devotion to

God.

From the depths of my heart as your Grand Knight I wish all of you a blessed Easter and the celebration of the full Easter season. To quote Saint Augustine, "*Resurrectio Domini, spes nostra - The Resurrection of the Lord is our hope.*" (Sermon 261:1). With these words, the great Bishop explained to the faithful that Jesus rose again so that we, the destined to die, should not despair, wearing that with death life is completely finished; rather, Christ is risen to give us hope.

When we consider God's mercy, it is nowhere more evident than in the Incarnation of his Son. When we had forgotten what it meant to be God's children, God sent his son among us as a child to go through every moment of our lives- not so that we would not have to, but to show us how to get it right. The mercy of Jesus is nowhere more evident than in his gathering up our sins and offering his life in return for them. Good Friday and Calvary illustrate the utter bankruptcy of human nature.

On the second Sunday of Easter, the Liturgy invites us to reflect specifically on Divine Mercy, which overcomes all human limitations and shines forth in the darkness of evil and sin. The Church urges us to have trust as we approach Christ, who thorough his Death and Resurrection fully and definitively reveals the extraordinary riches of God's merciful love (Jn 20:21-23).

Later this month we will host and conduct a special program recognizing the Sacred Heart of Jesus (details forthcoming shortly). We are looking at 5/28/2025 as a part of (following) 9:00AM Mass at OLOG (tentative).

Our Council will honor the Deceased on Memorial Day (5/26/25; further details forthcoming). Please join us at Gate of Heaven as we pray for all the souls of the faithfully departed. As you are aware, 2025 is a "Year of Jubilee". It is a year for reviving your Faith, to experiencing God's Mercy, and to be transformed into a beacon of hope for the World. Please consider seeking plenary indulgences which offer forgiveness for the temporal consequences of sins already forgiven. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory.

Finally, we are again conducting the Marian House Resident Appreciation program for June 7, 2025 1:00 PM. Flyer provides details. We cherish the opportunity to socialize with the community. This year marks the first time since Covid (2020) conducted the Inwood House, Grace House, and Marian House Resident programs. We are grateful to reach out to an important part of our community.

We are excited to share that at the MD State Council Convention held May 2 thru 4, 2025, our Council was recognized for its various Faith in Action Awards. We will be hosting an Awards Ceremony on June 14, 2025 following the 4:00 PM Mass on Saturday at Our Lady of Grace. Excited to acknowledge the many who have made this Fraternal successful.



We expect to be hosting an installation ceremony for the officers in the new fraternal year on July 26, 2025 at St Peter's Catholic Church. Celebration of the new Officers installation will take place at the elegant "Oak Room" at the Sandy Spring Firehouse immediately afterwards. *.

PHYSICIAN ASSISTED SUICIDE DEFEATED AGAIN; MARYLAND PRO-LIFE ADVOCATES DEFEAT BILL FOR THE 8TH TIME

The 447th session of the Maryland General Assembly came to a close without enacting the deadly Physician Assisted Suicide bills. Maryland Right to Life closely watched through the end of session to ensure that these lethal bills were in fact "dead".

The cross-filed bills, deceptively entitled as the "End Of Life Options Act", were introduced for the eighth time in the House (HB1328) by Delegate Terri Hill (D-Howard County) along with 48 other democrat lawmakers, and in the Senate (SB926) solely by Senator Will Smith (D-Montgomery County). As a result of unceasing opposition efforts, the bill stalled in the House and was denied a hearing altogether in the Senate.

We are extremely grateful to our supporters and partners who took action to oppose this dangerous bill that would license medical providers to kill and reduce the standard of medical care for all. Maryland Right to Life testified against the House bill alongside our partners including the Dignity Mandate and Patient's Rights Action Fund, who collaborated to present expert legal and medical witness testimonies.

Maryland Right to Life supporters sent an amazing 8,424 letters to legislators urging them to vote against the Physician Assisted Suicide to protect vulnerable individuals and the integrity of the medical profession. THANK YOU!).
