CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

We find ourselves in the holy season of Lent, which began on Ash Wednesday and will end as Holy Thursday ushers in the Holy Triduum, the most sacred three days in our year. How are we using this season of Lent to draw ourselves closer to Christ and so preparing ourselves to celebrate the Sacred Liturgy of Easter?

Reflect back on the words that began this season, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." These words of Christ, which are said when the ashes are placed on our heads, instruct us on the two main goals of Lent. Repent is a reminder for us to change our sinful ways and to try and extinguish any bad habits we have gained since last year. Believe in the Gospel then tells us to draw closer to Jesus who is the Word of God especially in the Sacred Scripture. By knowing the story of Jesus' life and His teachings; we can know better how we are to live our lives.

I encourage you to find time to bring your heart closer to Christ. Try to make a retreat, or a day of reflection, or a parish mission. Our Lady of the Lake and St. Catherine's will be making several opportunities available to you, as well as, the Archdiocesan Men's Conference on March 10, and opportunities for individuals at local retreat houses like Loyola Retreat House in Morristown. St. Catherine of Siena will offer a Parish Mission given on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, (March 24-26) at 7:30pm. Any or all of these are ways that you can spend just a little more time with God and prepare yourself to worship Him at Easter.

I encourage each of you to consider attending the Triduum, especially if you haven't been in a while. The Triduum is that time of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. These three liturgies are actually all part of the same liturgy. Notice the sign of the cross is only made at the beginning of Holy Thursday and at the end of the Easter Vigil. The beauty of these rituals not only remind us of the sacredness of these special days and the events they recall, but draw us closer to the Mystery of the Eucharist, which is Jesus Himself.

Finally, in all that you do by way of preparing for Easter and celebrating Easter, I encourage you to take from my reflections of our February social meeting. Here I encouraged you to remember that when the Paralytic was brought to Jesus for healing, the first thing he received was forgiveness, which is something we can all use. And without his friends, he would never have made it to see Jesus. I encourage you to exam your life and your friends. Consider are your friends leading you closer to Christ and allowing you to truly be who you are meant to be? And equally as important, are you leading your friends to Christ? Maybe this time of Lent is not only for you to prepare for Easter, but also a time for you to help your neighbor. Consider inviting a friend to one of the Lenten Events that you will attend, maybe invite a friend with you to the Holy Triduum, or maybe consider inviting a friend to join the Knights, for even in this way you are helping them draw closer to our Savior, Jesus Christ. INSURANCE

IT TAKES MORE THAN MONEY

Most commodities can be bought provided you 1) have the money, 2) can find a willing seller, and 3) can agree on a satisfactory price. In like manner, most investments - real estate, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, bank accounts - require only an arm's length agreement and a deal is struck. All it takes is money.
