**AN OPEN LETTER OF APPEAL FROM
FR. TESHAMARIAM BARAKI**

Fr. Tesfa has been a long time member of our council who was transferred to a Washington DC mission many years ago. Fr. Testfa was once a parish priest at Our Lady of the Lake. He was a close friend of our Past District Deputy and OLL parishioner, the late Emil Granconola. Several weeks ago, he reached out to our council for help. Here is his appeal:

To: Father James J. Kelly, Council 3632 (Verona-Cedar Grove)
My Dear Brother Knights of Columbus
Greetings in the Lord!

After a long silence, here am I contacting you during this Holy Season of sacrifice and self-denial concerning my nephew, Assefa Hailu Baraki, a victim of dual renal failure in Ethiopia and in great danger of life. Not knowing what to do how to save my nephew, I am sending this appeal note to my Council with which I never have been active due to physical distance and heavy priestly duties and pastoral responsibilities here in Washington, DC, for over 28 years already.

Since October of 2010, I have been extensively involved to save the life of my nephew by collecting some donations here in the United States for his kidney dialysis back in Ethiopia in order to prolong his life. By the grace of God and the help of generous friends and benefactors here in the US, my nephew's has been prolonged and relatively stable.

Now for many months here in Washington, DC, I have been negotiating with and appealing to the Georgetown University Hospital seeking a probono medical assistance to my nephew. And there has been made a good progress and there is a good chance of getting a probono kidney transplantation for him. At this time, everything is in process and under pre-transplant evaluation stage.

But there are some major challenges remaining to the family: I am told by the GU Hospital that the family must be in a position to be able to providing anti-rejection (immunorepressant) drugs for the patient immediately after the transplantation surgery and then for the rest of his life. Those medications are extremely expensive for the family to afford.

Secondly, due to the delays in the process and evaluations, we are running out of funds for his regular hemodialysis in Ethiopia, and I am very much afraid that he might die before the kidney transplantation takes place here in Washington, DC at GUH (hopefully and prayerfully!).

I was wondering the Father James J. Kelly Council to which still I belong as an inactive member could come to the rescue of my nephew by helping me raise some emergency funds from brother Knights in New Jersey or any other people of goodwill. Would be possible to conduct during this Holy Season of Lent or the Easter Season or after or anytime to conduct for me a (**ONE-DOLLAR**) gift from fellow Knights or others as well to save life of one-young-student who desperately fighting to live against all the odds?

I am attaching here below some appeal information that you could share with any Knights of Columbus Council or with any groups or individuals or clubs or organizations or businesses who might be helpful to us in saving this young student's life.

I would greatly appreciate if you could share this urgent appeal message with them via electronic means so that that the receivers can learn about the critical situations of this boy who is desperately seeking for help to live. Your brief recommendation would be of great help and would be deeply appreciated.

Thank you very much for your kindness, cooperation and collaboration in this life-saving cause and endeavor!

And I wish you blessed Holy Week and Easter.
