***Supreme Chaplain's Monthly
Challenge - May 2021***

“As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commandments and remain in his love. ... This is my commandment:

Love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.” (Gospel for May 9, Jn 15:9-10, 12-13)

Christ tells us we will remain in his love if we keep his commandments. Saying you love someone can be easy, but it is really our deeds that reveal our love — or lack of it. Christ showed us how to love by his example and by sacrificing his very life for us. To love as Christ commands us to love demands action. The Letter of James says, “Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves” (1:22). May each of us commit to keeping the commandments and offering our very selves in service and sacrifice for others.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to meditate on the meaning of the Ten Commandments in your life by picking one on 10 different days and praying about it for at least 10 minutes. Second, during this month devoted to our Blessed Mother, I challenge you to assist your council in implementing the Faith in Action Rosary program — showing your love of Christ by showing your love of Mary.


Council Events and Issues:

Programs and dates:

2. Ontario State 50/50 Draw: All Councils are able to participate in Pilot #3 which starts July 1st, 2021 with the draw date on Sept 30, 2021 and Pilot #4 is Oct 1st, 2021 with draw date on Dec 31, 2021.

3. Right to Life Programs:

The 9 day Canadian Novena for the Cause of Life is May 5 to May 13, 2021.

May 9-13 is the date of the mainly virtual annual National March for Life (Parliament Hill and online).

May 13 is also the feast of Our Lady of Fatima.

4. Convention: 118th Ontario State - Virtual Convention:

May 1, 2021, 9am – noon.

Registration deadline for the two Council delegates, usually the GK and DGK, is April 18, 2021.

The Council will have two votes for 19 Resolutions and there will be a vote for one State position: State Warden (John Semaan, Henry Miller and Earle DePass). The positions of State Deputy (Marcel Lemmen), State Secretary (Bruce Poulin) and State Treasurer (David Gelinias), State Advocate (Joseph Bodnar) are all single validated candidates who may be acclaimed.

5. Award and program report submissions: Columbian Award Application is due by June 30th and the Fraternal Programs Report Form for all additional programs conducted. (Online submission - one report form per program.)

6. Council Elections: Nominating committee to recommend officers for the next fraternal year. The committee should look beyond the usual volunteers to find a good mix of candidates representing fresh ideas and sound council practices. Virtual election guidelines are available to assist councils still dealing with pandemic restrictions.

Lecturer's Talk: Michael Creaghan

The Monarchy



Have you ever thought about how we are defined as a country? Here is an extremely brief history.

Our country Canada was established in 1867 by our fathers of Confederation in Charlottetown, PEI. The British North American Act (BNA) became Canada's Constitution. We adopted the British parliamentary system while still having provincial governments. We became a country, independent but still under the umbrella of the British Empire. Our head of state was Queen Victoria.

We had four provinces, Quebec, Ontario, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. Our first Prime Minister was John A Macdonald. By 1905 we had 9 provinces, the NWT and the Yukon. Newfoundland and Labrador joined in 1947. The Hudson Bay Company owned Rupert's Land which was larger than all of Europe which was sold to Canada in 1870. England wanted to continue control over Canada. The British Empire was at its peak and colonial independence was a possible danger. Giving Canada nationhood was the solution avoiding a bigger danger of American expansionism. The wars of 1776 and 1812 were still fresh on their minds. Our history is boring and full of compromises, no winners, no losers and little bloodshed. This happened because we had men with high ideals and forethought These fathers of Confederation along with Macdonald could see a great future in this new country, Canada. The most important were George-Etienne Cartier and George Brown. Macdonald has been vilified for his treatment of our First Nation people and Metis with some justification. But far more important was Macdonald's persistence in building the railway west linking Canada coast to Coast. A Mari usque ad Mare.

We are a constitutional monarchy. Our head of state is The Queen, Our Queen, Queen Elizabeth. When Canada was born our treaties with our First Nation people were ratified under Queen Victoria.

Why have a monarchy?

The monarchy is British, it is an aristocracy, it no longer serves any purpose. It doesn't even represent most Canadians who are not of British origin. It is out of date. It is expensive. This is all true. We can go on vilifying the monarchy with much justification. It has been said that our constitutional monarchy is the best of the worst.

In a freely elected republic, such as the USA, the head of government and the head of state is the president who represents a political party. There is no bipartisan representation. The US is now a country divided, seemingly lacking any common ground.

In Canada, our Queen is represented by our Governor General who is the head of state. This position is non-political and for the most part held by highly respected individuals. The Governor General bridges the divide between political parties. She or he provides a softening of animosities. In times of great crisis the monarchy has provided an illusion of stability. Our parliament is opened by the GG reading the speech from the throne. An election is called by the prime minister going to the GG to dissolve the government. All acts of parliament are symbolically under the authority of the Queen. The Queen is the honorary head of our Canadian Forces and many of the Royal Family are honorary colonels of Canadian Regiments.

We have had some great governor generals representing all peoples from all walks of life and all over Canada. The Canadian GG were Vincent Massey, Georges Vanier, Roland Mitchener, Jules Leger, Ed Schreyer, Jeanne Sauve, Ray Hnatyshyn, Romeo LeBlanc, Adrienne Clarkson, Michaelle Jean, David Johnston and Jullie Payette. All great Canadians who loved this country.

The GG serves in many celebratory events such as opening of Sports and Entertainment venues, hospitals, public buildings and parks. The GG gives out the Order of Canada Awards and the Governor General Awards to very worthy Canadians. The receiving of these awards is not from a political person but from the Queen's representative.
